PASTOR'S PEN

PUTTING GOD FIRST: Prioritizing Congregational Worship

"Let us draw near to God...And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another" - Hebrews 10:22,24 & 25 NIV)

God's people - and that's who we are, Calvary – are those who recognize God as the Blesser "from whom all blessings flow" and the Giver of "every good and every perfect gift." God is the One who loved the world (that includes you and me) so much that "He gave His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life," (John 3:16 NIV). Who would not want to worship and praise such a blessing, loving, giving God? While at first glance this question may appear to be rhetorical, it actually requires a thoughtful response. The writer of Hebrews observed that "some are in the habit" of "giving up meeting together."

Worship and praise are expressions of our gratitude directed toward God. Worship is adoration, reverence and glorification of God's character – who God is. True praise is the outward manifestation of inward worship. As we are often exhorted, when we think of the goodness of Jesus and all that God has done for us in sending Him to save us; when we think of how God wakes us up each day and sustains us throughout each week; it ought to cause us to come to the house of God to give thanks – not only for who God is but also for all that God does.

We know that worship is scheduled every Sunday. But, do we make it a point to ensure that worship is prioritized every Sunday? Are we putting God first in our lives? Or, are we coming to church when it's convenient? God's people come together regularly to encourage one another. They are not only interested in sending their praises up so God's blessings can come down. The people of God also want to be a blessing to others. Jesus says, "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another," (John 13:35 NKJV). Relationality distinguishes disciples. We can only do good deeds for one another and show love for one another by coming together. You cannot be relational with people you do not know. In other words, while you can worship God away from the church, you cannot be all that God has called you to be apart from a congregation of believers.

Come to congregational worship because there are seasons when you need encouragement and there are seasons when your brothers and sisters in Christ will need you to be their encourager. Join in corporate worship because there are days and times throughout the day when you need a Word from the Lord to get you through. In those instances you will not have a Word unless you have come to hear the Word. Just as there are new mercies from God every morning, there are new dilemmas in life every day. We learn from Jesus that nothing can defeat our Adversary like the Word of God can. While in the wilderness being tempted by Satan, Jesus' constant refrain was, "it is written." If you want to live a victorious life as a child of God, you need to be present when the Word of God is shared.

When worship is a priority, we attend regularly and we arrive on time. We view worship as our opportunity to show our appreciation of the fact that

God has blessed us beyond measure. In the words of the psalmist, we are delighted to "enter into His gates with thanksgiving and into His courts with praise," (Psalm 100:4 NKJV). When worship is a priority and God is first, we do not plan to arrive after praise and worship. We do not treat praise and worship like the previews at the movies or the opening act that comes out to warm us up before the main attraction.

I have changed the order of our worship experience to afford all of us the opportunity to participate in Praise & Worship. Beginning this Sunday, Praise & Worship is central. I pray that as we go forward collectively, each of us will commit to putting God first and prioritizing congregational worship. Let us draw near to God together.

The Wellspring Ministry at Calvary ran a seminar earlier this year titled "Chicken Soup for the Soul." This article is one of the subjects addressed in the companion handbook that was developed. This is first in a series from that session.

You might think that the Bible wouldn't have much to say about unemployment. Who loses their job in the Bible? Although King Saul loses his powerful kingship to a young shepherd boy, and although silversmiths in Ephesus might have gone bankrupt after Paul's successful mission there (Acts 19), there aren't many others examples of mass layoffs and economic downturn.

But while there aren't any direct passages on 'unemployment," the Bible gives us broad principles about work, which will help us when we don't have a job. God has a very positive view of work. God is a worker and work is important in our lives as Christians since we were created in His image. We were created as workers and instructed by God to work and rule the world. After the Fall, work became difficult and toilsome, but it remains part of what we are to do in this world. We are gifted by God and given wisdom by Him to achieve dominion over our circumstances and our world.

However, our society's elevated view of work isn't what the Bible emphasizes. Work is not the end, nor even the means to the end. Just as the exiles in Jeremiah's day were to settle down, work, have families while awaiting their restoration, so we as 'aliens and exiles' in this passing world are to be at work (Jer 23; I Peter 1). God expects us to work to provide for our families and to be generous to others (I Thes 4:11-12; 2 Thes 3:11-12; Eph 4:28).

Being unemployed can be very hard to handle, but we must see things as completely under God's sovereign rule and control. Understanding the Bible on work helps us gain a proper perspective and helps us understand how even this unfortunate turn of events can be managed. Here are some points to ponder:

• God is sovereign. The first thing to understand is that nothing happens without God's control. It's easy to see unemployment as a complete disaster and be totally negative about it. God has not forgotten us. He still cares about us and will look after us. We need to remind ourselves of what God's word says when we face trials in life, in passages such as Job 1-2 (especially 1:20-22), Phil 4:11-13, Rom 5:1-5, 8:28-37, 2 Cor 1:3-11, I Peter 1:3-9).

• Your worth as a person is based on your relationship with God through Jesus. Our society makes a big deal of what job

we do, telling us the lie, which we are inclined to believe, that our value is in our work and what we achieve. God's word tells us work is transitory. Even the greatest achievements in this world are passing (Ecc 2:17-24). What matters is our relationship with God and obedience to his commands (Ecc 12:13-14). No matter what your job or whether you have one, you are loved by God, created in his image, redeemed by the precious blood of his Son. You are valuable and significant and worthwhile in God's sight.

• It is wrong to be idle and lazy. It is not wrong to be unemployed, but it is wrong to be unwilling to work and to take responsibility to provide for yourself and others, as Paul tells the Thessalonians (in 2 Thes 3:6-11). If you are not willing to work, you should not eat. Lazy people should not be allowed to sponge off others.

• An unemployed person has work. Even a person without paid work has plenty to do; we mustn't be idle. There are at least two 'jobs' for an unemployed person:

1. Finding a job ought to be your full-time job. Unemployed people are paid a 'job search allowance', and you ought to commit a similar number of hours to it each week as you would put in as an employed person, chasing down work, going to relevant agencies, knocking on doors, writing letters, making calls. Remember, God is in control and will provide for our needs. Be patient and prayerful.

2. Keep on with the job of being a Christian. It is easy to become discouraged and self-focused when you face suffering and hardship. You need to work hard at hearing God's word week by week, at prayer and staying in Christian fellowship. Even after working to find a job, you may have some hours free in the week which can be used to serve others.

God is Jehovah-Jireh – He will provide!



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BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVE *NAVIGATING OUR FINANCES IN A SEASON OF DROUGHT BY MINISTER DAVID A. HOLLOWELL*

"Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." - Matthew 6:31-33 (KJV)

In this approaching holiday season, many of us encounter stresses and strains in the financial arena as we often seek to lavish ourselves and others with gifts and extravagancies that we usually avoid during the rest of the year. These pressures tend to be exacerbated in times of economic distress and dislocation that we now find ourselves in, and we have difficulty defining practical solutions. However, some of the situations we are confronted with are of our own making.

If we are having problems in the area of our finances, we need to examine God's Word as to what He says about finances and then line up with that Word. Are we handling our money wisely? True wisdom comes from God and the Bible has revelation about money problems as well as others.

There is no doubt that many people in this country (and the rest of the world), at every level in the social strata, are having financial problems. Even wealthy people are concerned that their assets are eroding because of inflation, and as the worth of the dollar drops steadily in an unstable global economy. Stock markets around the world have taken a beating. People are contemplating bankruptcy and even more radical actions due to such heavy money pressures. Many marriages are also under extreme stress and divorce has risen due to unresolved financial difficulties.

Is there an answer to all the money problems? Yes, the Bible has the answer to this problem as well as all others that face humankind. Briefly, we are going to write down a basic financial check list based on the Word of God. On this list we are going to look at some things that can hinder our ability to meet our financial challenges. As Christians, we are promised the blessings of God, not the curses of the devil. The promise of prosperity and blessing belongs to us, not the curse of poverty and fear – not as an end in itself, but as a spillover of the spiritual well-being wherewith God endows us.

As children adopted into the family of God, He expects us to reflect the characteristics of his seed. A total commitment to God is the very first step to financial blessings. However, there are many Christians who still have not gained the victory in finances due to other principles in God's Word that have been ignored. Let's ask ourselves some questions that will bring us financial freedom if we are agreeing with the Word of God in these matters.

This article invites us to begin our own checklist of items that may affect our family's financial health. As we address this list, we will move on in next month's issue at other important areas for examination: **1.** Are we giving at least 10% to the work of God which is the tithe? (If not, we are using God's money, and robbing Him.) Malachi 3:10: "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it." Matthew 23:23 "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cumin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgment, mercy, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone."

2. Are we giving our tithe to the ministry where we are being fed? (Offerings, above the tithe, may be given to the poor, good works, etc.; however, our tithe should go to the spreading of the gospel. Additional offerings also should be given to the church and its five-fold ministries as listed in Ephesians 4:11; apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers.) 2 Corinthians 9:6-8: "But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall reap also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudg-ingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work."

3. Are we giving to God first, before paying other bills? Proverbs 3:9-10: "Honour the Lord with thy substance, and with the firstfruits of all thine increase: So shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine."

4. Are we indifferent to the needs of the poor? Proverbs 28:27: "He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse."

5. Are we going in debt for lustful things? Wants, instead of needs? 1 Timothy 6:6-10: "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content."

6. Are we planning and budgeting our financial spending? Luke 14:28-30: "For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he has sufficient to finish it? Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish it, all that behold it begin to mock him, Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish."

If we honestly and prayerfully begin to take this personal inventory, we will be well on our way to establishing financial mastery, even in a season of drought.
