DEEPENING DISCIPLESHIP: FROM THE INSIDE OUT

In keeping with our 2011 thematic emphasis – New Wine In New Wineskins: Changing for the Better – we began the year studying *Our Iceberg Is Melting*, a small book that gave us big ideas about the need to change in order to survive and thrive. This summer, we are launching two “New Wine” initiatives that will help us accomplish our mission (to glorify God by making disciples of Jesus Christ through our commitment to worship, Word and witness): □ Church School Emphasis Month (June); and □ Inside Out (July).

Inspired by the Sermon on the Mount, where Jesus and His disciples ascend a mountain for training in discipleship, Church School Emphasis Month is a church-wide initiative designed to deepen discipleship through study of the Word. Our aim is to pro-

duce functionally mature, responsible, reproducing members of God’s church.

Our training days during the month of June will prepare us to respond to the Great Commission, “go and make disciples of all nations,” (Matt 28:19). Church School Emphasis Month will help us:

- Understand and act upon the privilege and responsibility disciples of Christ have to learn and apply the Word.
- Equip ourselves with the fundamentals of the faith so we can witness to our families, neighbors, classmates and coworkers.
- Become more cognizant of and committed to the need to go beyond the walls of the sanctuary to meet the needs of others through missions.

In July, Inside Out will take us beyond the four walls of

the sanctuary. We’ll literally move many of the activities that we would do inside the church outside into our community. Based upon Matthew 5:13-16, where Jesus challenges Christians to act as salt and light – changing the world for the better – and commands us to let our lights shine before others so that they may see our good deeds and glorify God, Inside Out will afford each of us an opportunity to help expand the kingdom.

One of God’s chosen methods of Kingdom Expansion is witnessing, or evangelism. This must be done by people, to people, and for people. In order for us to witness to people, we must go where they are to engage them in their environment. Therefore, starting in July and continuing throughout the remainder of the year, we will actively

engage in Kingdom Expansion through: (a) participation in July’s Inside Out activities; and (b) ongoing involvement with our Outreach Ministries: Evangelism, Interfaith, Missions and Prison.

Deepen your discipleship in June and then help us expand God’s kingdom in July. Details on both initiatives will be provided in the Sunday bulletin. ■

Nominees for the Master Music Teacher Award can be selected by any interested person. Once nominated, all candidates are automatically considered and a committee composed of retired New Jersey music educators conduct classroom visitations of each nominee to watch them in action. Armed with specific criterion the committee records copious notes before selecting the award recipient. The Master Music Teacher Award can be presented to a maximum of three teachers annually. Brother Brown was one of two recipients.

THE VALUE OF EDUCATION

We congratulate our graduates at all levels for your steadfastness in reaching an important milestone in your lives. Whether you are a middle school student moving on to high school, a high school student moving on to college or a career, or a college grad entering or re-entering the job market, you probably will not have realized the magnitude of your accomplishment until some time in the future, when you have had a chance to decompress and reflect on what has transpired.

To those of you who are purpose-driven and tightly focused, this may be a moment which you do not want to dwell on, and which you anxiously want to put behind you as you press on to the next rung on the ladder of success. To others this may be a time when you are caught in limbo, pondering “how did I make it this far?” or “Where do I go from here?” In either case, this may be a propitious occasion to reflect on where you have been and where you are going, and the value of education.

In any case, your education has been a journey, and in all likelihood will be a continuing journey. This journey is one which most of us view from the perspective of our

final destination – the end point where we can disembark from our travels and enjoy the fruits of our pursuit. On the other hand, the speakers at hundreds and thousands of commencement addresses across the land often focus on graduation as a new beginning – a vital phase in our lives that pushes us to the next stage of intellectual and/or occupational development.

Whether we give attention to its end or its beginning, we are all prone to ask the question, “What value is this process to me?” “What does an education really do for me?”

It is generally agreed that education, especially attaining a college degree, has some very practical benefits. In addition to opening up doors of opportunity, the plusses are considerable: longer life-spans; greater economic stability and security; more lucrative employment and greater job satisfaction; less dependency on government assistance; greater participation in leisure and artistic activities; greater community service and leadership; and more self-confidence, among other things.

But for us as believers, the value of education goes much further. We learn from the Bible that we are not

our own. We have been purchased at a price and are only stewards of the gifts that the Holy Spirit has deposited in us. Education gives us the privilege and responsibility to discover and nurture those gifts so we can become all that God wants us to be. Uniquely, we can look beyond education as a means to an end in serving ourselves, but as a vehicle to equip ourselves to serve others in the Kingdom of God. The book of Proverbs tells us that we should seek after knowledge, but while we acquire it, we should also get understanding. This understanding can ultimately lead to wisdom, that precious jewel that can enhance our lives and the lives of those around us. As we live and learn, our education can lead us to love: to love our God who has loved us enough to allow us to become citizens in His Kingdom; to love ourselves, and the opportunity to educate ourselves to our purpose and destiny, and to love others as the perfect outworking of God’s mercy and grace. This is the real value of education. ■

The Mahalia Jackson Fellowship Hall provided a friendly, nurturing setting for a rich dialogue among the participants.

All three speakers stressed the importance of self-assessment in understanding what we really want in a work situation and determining how we really want to fulfill our career aspirations. Among the many points

brought out in the interchange, some of the salient highlights they spoke on included:

- Striving to do well in studies and employment in order to build a solid record of accomplishment
- Developing the discipline to focus on quality preparation
- Being flexible and having the ability to change course when certain paths do not work out
- Learning to network and seek help from others who can use their influence to help us

- Developing good habits that can serve us well in all of life, such as courtesy, punctuality, persistence, and a solid work ethic
- Avoiding personal associations that can divert us from our goals and objectives
- Setting high expectations for ourselves, and developing the spiritual foundation to

fortify us when we encounter disappointments

With a good meal to promote the fellowship and family orientation of the program, the conversation was positive and encouraging for all involved. Sister Vanessa Brown, Ministry Chair, and Sister Kimberly Monroe, Program Chair, helped move the proceedings along, and expressed a desire that our youth and adults would act upon the sage advice that was shared to help us all become what God has given us the potential to be. ■

On behalf of the Community Soup Kitchen and Outreach Center and the many guests we serve, I would like to thank you for your very generous donation of \$360.00 for our Share the Bounty Fundraising Event. We have you down for six reservations.

Since 1984, the Community Soup Kitchen has been helping our homeless, working poor, elderly and disabled neighbors by serving a hot noon-time meal and providing supportive services 365 days a year. We have never closed our doors or missed a single day in 26 years.

In 2010, the guests coming through our doors needed more help than ever before. Last year, we served **over 56,000 meals**, distributed **over 40 tons of food**, and provided **over 2,000 medical and social service referrals** through our Outreach Center.

Every guest has a story...here is just one:

Charlie and Connie were hard workers who had three children. Charlie was a night watchman making \$8 an hour, while Connie worked days as a health care aide. One day, their only car broke down — they couldn't afford a new

one. Then Connie was laid off from work and they weren't able to pay their rent. Though she desperately looked for a job, Connie couldn't find one. Charlie and Connie and their children were welcomed into our dining room for a hot meal. Our Community Advocate helped them with their immediate needs — shelter, food and finding Connie a job. After coming to the Soup Kitchen for three months, They were finally able to save enough to get another apartment. Today, they are both working and with the help of the Soup Kitchen, they are back on their feet.

Thanks to your generosity, the Community Soup Kitchen and Outreach Center will be able to continue to help thousands of other men, women and children in 2011, just like Charlie and Connie.

ONE HEART, ONE MIND: A UNITED COMMUNITY EFFORT FOR FREE HIV TESTING

Three local church and community groups are coming together on two dates to offer one critical health screening test. Which groups, what dates and what health screening test you ask? Touch Ministry of Calvary Baptist Church, ANGELS in Action (formerly known as Bethel ANGELS) and Helping Hands of Church of God In Christ for All Saints of Morristown, are teaming up to sponsor HIV testing in June and July.

For many years, the groups held individual events to recognize National HIV Testing Day, which is June 27. Last year, Touch Ministry, ANGELS in Action and Helping Hands decided to fuse their passion and collectively sponsor HIV testing for the community.

The impact of the partnership was great; many people took the test and were empowered with knowledge to help them take control of their lives and make informed decisions.

Once again, the groups are coordinating their efforts to offer free HIV rapid testing on Saturday, June 11th from 9 am to 1 pm (rain date Saturday, June 25th, same times) and Saturday, July 16th from 10 am to 2 pm. The testing is confidential and will be provided by the Mobile HIV Testing Van Unit of North Jersey Community Initiative. Have you taken the HIV test? Has it been a while since you last took the test? No more wondering. Come out, take the test and get your results in just 20 minutes. ■

SHINING A LIGHT ON CALVARY MEMBER



Trustee James Vance

As we approach another Father's Day celebration, representatives from the Women of Purpose thought it would be apropos to highlight the accomplishments of one of Calvary's own men who has stood tall over the years in service to church and community. That honor today goes to James Vance, who everyone refers to fondly as Brother Jim Vance.

Brother Vance has served a remarkable tenure of over 45 years as Treasurer of Calvary, and has been virtually a lifelong member. Known to all the longtime residents, he stood tall as a student athlete at Morristown High School, excelling at track & field, football, and in his upper-class years, as a member of the boxing team. In his most celebrated season in 1948, he ran 17 touchdowns in 9 games to lead his team to a state championship.

In 1949, Brother Vance received a football scholarship to attend Syracuse University, but before finishing his degree, the Korean War broke out, and he was drafted into the U.S. Army. While in the Army, he was trained as a Medical Technician, and had the opportunity to serve at many of the nation's major Army hospitals. After completing his tour of duty, Brother Vance returned to Syracuse in 1953, and rejoined the football squad, where he teamed up as fullback with the great halfback Jim Brown and developed a life-long friendship.

Having returned to Morristown, he set his sights on further education, and eventually earned two Masters' degrees from Seton Hall University. Building on his work in the Army, he has been serving as a Registered Physical Therapist for the past 50 years. Standing tall as an educator, he began his career at Morristown High School as a teacher in 1962 until his retirement in 1995.

Brother Vance has always stood tall as a servant of the church. When he married his childhood sweetheart Wilhelmina (whom he had known since age 13) Brother Vance was highly regarded as a solid citizen and family man. His predecessor as Treasurer, Brother Walker, was particularly impressed with young Vance, and recommended him as a replacement when

he retired. His confidence was amply justified since Brother Vance has been supervising the financial operations of the church ever since.

From making all of the deposits and writing all of the checks in his early days, Brother Vance has helped to establish a broader and more diverse Trustee team where he has helped to direct the path of Calvary's future. Because of his business acumen and local connections, Brother Vance has played a key role in expanding Calvary's facilities. A short list includes, (1) purchasing the old coal yard on the corner of Willow Street and M.L. King Avenue and contracting to have it cleared and paved as Calvary's first parking lot; (2) negotiating the purchase of the Rowe Building across the street from the main building; (3) purchasing the property next to the Wellspring Center which has been converted to Calvary's second public parking lot, to name a few. His proactive and visionary leadership has been vital in shaping the present and future of Calvary.

Even with such a full plate, Brother Vance never relinquished his role as an athlete and supporter of other athletes. At one time, he was crowned as amateur heavyweight boxing champion in the state of New Jersey. Because of his reputation and training as a therapist and trainer, he was called upon to be head trainer for the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles and in 1996 for the World Boxing Team in Atlanta, Georgia, which also acquainted him with such famous boxers as Evander Holyfield, Muhammad Ali, Joe Frazier, George Foreman, and Ken Norton.

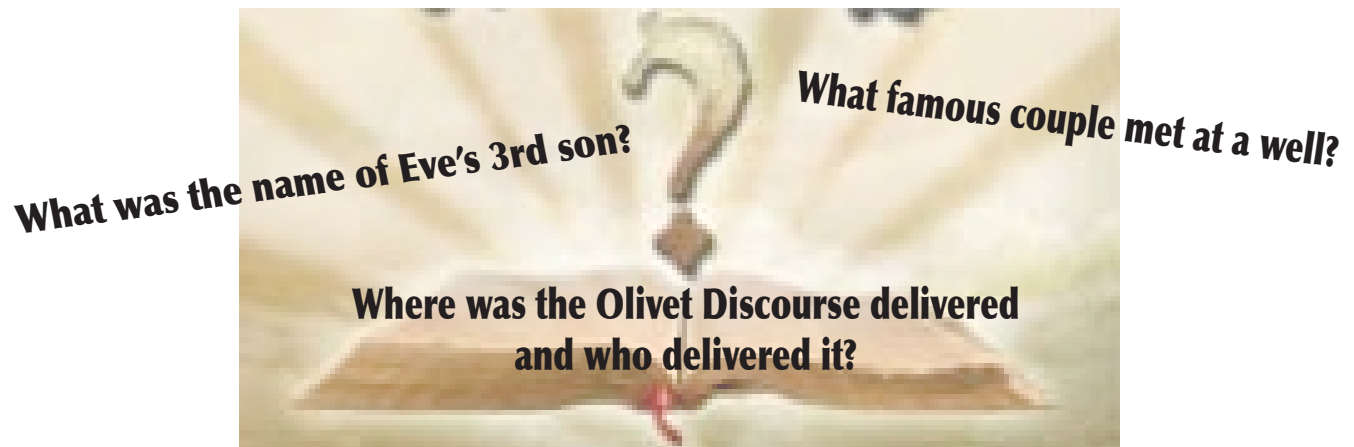
As a patriarch, Brother Vance stands tall as a family man. He is a devoted husband who celebrates 56 years of marriage. He has three daughters, Wilhelmina, Jamie, and Ina, and has been blessed with five great-great grandchildren. We salute Brother Vance for all of his contributions to Calvary, to his family, and to the community, and thank God for his presence as a good man standing tall. ■
