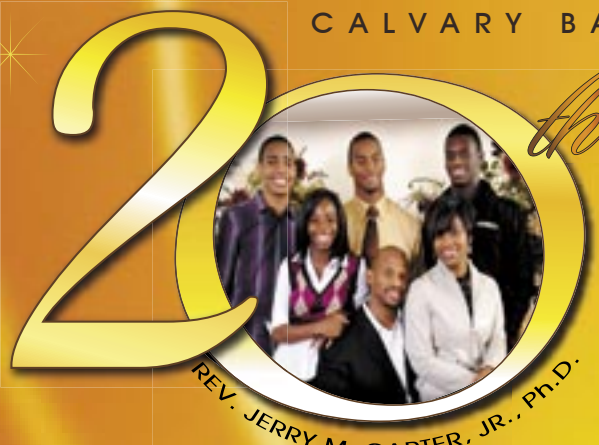

BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVE

A PATHWAY TO RESTORATION

And Nathan said to David, "The LORD also has taken away your sin; you shall not die." – 2 Samuel 12:13b

In this classic Biblical account in the life of David, we see a story of (1) the commission of a great sin; (2) King David's futile attempt to cover it up, and; (3) a magnificent display of God's grace and love, which leads David down a pathway to forgiveness and restoration.

The story begins with David being out of place in what could be considered an irresponsible action. Instead of undertaking his kingly role of accompanying his men in battle, David decides he is going to take a break from war and return to his home and temporarily abandon his role as military leader. While enjoying his self-authorized leave from the action as he lounged on his roof, David was captivated by the sight of Bathsheba, a young woman bathing with no knowledge that she was seen by others. David immediately sent one of his men to fetch the young lady and his fascination with her beauty led to a grievous act of adultery.

Knowing that Bathsheba was the wife of one of his own soldiers did not abate the lust that David had in pursuing this illicit union. But there are consequences to evil, and when the woman later

made it known to David that she had conceived, David did everything in his power to cover up the mess, including sending her husband to the frontlines so he would surely be killed.

However, we cannot hide our sins from God, and the prophet Nathan was used by God to reveal the truth and ugliness of David's actions, so that David's very own testimony condemned him. And even though David was severely chastised, even to the point of the conceived child dying, the story does not end here. With a deep chord of remorse, David poured out his heart to God in an act of contrition and repentance, and God in his infinite mercy forgave him, blessing him with another son who would succeed him as King of Israel.

If we are honest with ourselves, all of us have fallen into situations that reflect rebellion against God, sometimes through ignorance, but more often than not, through our own sinful desires for self-gratification. But like David, when we realize the gravity of our mistakes, God wonderfully gives us the chance to be restored. No matter what the shame or fault or deficiency, we can follow David's example to get on God's path to restoration by (1) Recognizing our failures and the serious nature of our wrongdoings; (2) Accepting responsibil-

ity for what we have done instead of shifting blame to others; (3) Repenting by turning away from the clutches of the sin that has bound us; (4) Receiving with humility the correction and rebuke that comes from the Holy Spirit; (5) Reconciling our broken spirits with the comforting mercy espoused in God's holy Word, and; (6) Responding with joy and thanks giving to the restoration that only God can bring to our live. ■



JOIN KOINONIA SINGLES MINISTRY FOR A READ & MEET WITH NICOLE B. SIMPSON

Nicole B. Simpson and I met approximately six years ago at an event where we were seeking many avenues upon

which we could build upon our dreams. Later, I'd find myself behind a mike as a guest on her radio show, *The Power of Gospel*. We've kept in touch ever since. Ever reaching higher to fulfill her God ordained purpose, Simpson continues to augment into territories that will facilitate such while helping others along the way. Considered by some to be "one of the most inspiring and motivating orientation speakers, Ms. Simpson will be joining the Koinonia Singles Ministry in September to share her testimony and talk about her latest book, *Dare 2 Dream*. To whet your appetite, I asked her a view questions as a precursor to September's event.

By way of introduction, are you a native of New Jersey? If not, where are you from? Who are your parents and do you have any siblings? I was born and raised in New Jersey to David Manley and Wilma Cuthbertson. I have three sisters that I grew up with but have

three more sisters who I also maintain a relationship with.

Tell me a little about the book. Why did you write it and what do you wish to convey to the reader? I wrote *Dare 2 Dream* because I felt it was a message the world needed to hear. I was invited to speak at a women's conference several years ago and the host of the conference gave me the title after prayer. She said the Lord had revealed to her that I had a message that needed to be delivered. That message has allowed me to travel throughout the United States. In addition, I was fortunate to share *Dare 2 Dream* with incarcerated men and women. I have seen, firsthand, individuals who felt life was unkind and unfair, begin to dream again and pursue their dreams as if their life depended on it. Hope has been restored and many of the success stories I hear personally come from individuals who have made significant mistakes or poor decisions in their past. After seeing the powerful reactions of people for the last several years, I felt a sense of urgency to put the message in a book to share with everyone who has ever been discouraged and disappointed by the hand they were dealt in life. The message I want to convey to the reader is that in spite of what obstacles you may have faced in the past, the negative words people

may have spoken into your life, you are still capable of fulfilling your dreams. If you have breath, you have opportunity. It may be challenging but it is possible to accomplish your heart's desires.

You are also a minister. Who in particular do you minister to and what is your ultimate aim? I am an Elder at Rhema Word Ministries under the leadership of Pastor John E. Blacknall. My ministry assignment is one of an evangelist and I've been privileged to deliver a deliverance message throughout the country. However, you can also find me on the streets of Carteret and Edison, NJ.

In addition to street ministry, I have been blessed that several prison facilities have extended an invitation to me through-

out the years in addition to ministering in a traditional church. My ultimate objective is to let people know God is real and capable of delivering [anyone] from any traumatic experience [they] may have encountered. I also believe in teaching people how to find Christ for themselves, not church. It is my fundamental belief that how you communicate with someone who accepts Christ

into their life at the point of decision, will determine whether the seeds will take root and grow, or if the person will fade back into their former existence.

Do you still host the radio program at Rutgers? If so, tell me a little about that? I host The Power of Gospel radio show, which airs on WRSU 88.7 FM every Sunday evening at 9:00 p.m. In addition, I can also be heard on www.power101gospel.com, which is an online radio station owned by Harvest Wealth Media Group. The online station is available 24 hours daily. We believe that we are blessed to be a blessing to others and our objective is to

deal with real life issues from a biblical perspective.

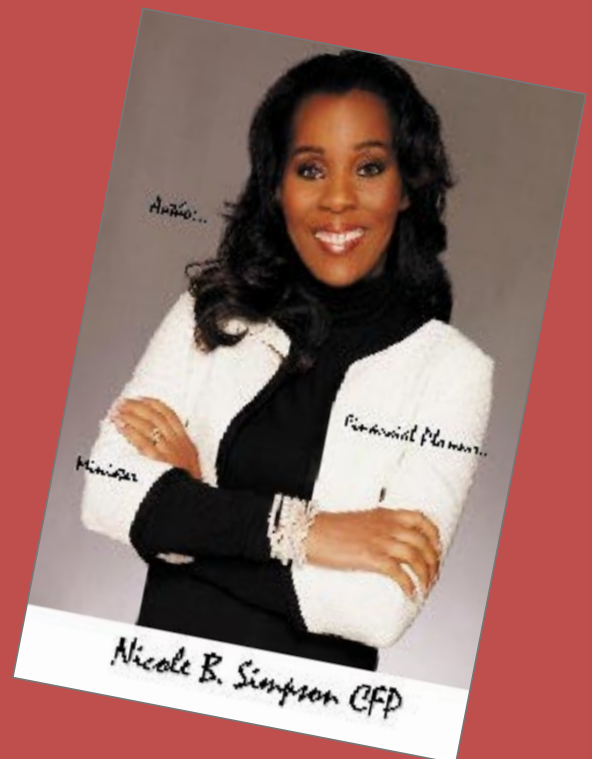
Are you working on any new projects, books at the current time? At this present moment I am working on my 4th book. This book is very personal because of my experiences in the last decade. As a World Trade Center survivor who has struggled significantly in the last ten years, I wanted to see where others survivors stand 10 years later as well. I haven't solidified the title yet, but the premise of the book will reflect on the last decade for other survivors – what struggles, success and life adjustments they made after the tragedy of

September 11, 2001. I anticipate that the book will be available in the 1st quarter 2011.

Simpson has been featured in Black Enterprise and appeared on Money Matters with Lynn Doyle. She is also a BET.COM Profile to Success award recipient and is a recognized Disaster Planning Specialist.

the festivities. Sister Martin is the oldest living member of Calvary, and was born on July 4, 1910.

With her quick wit, phenomenal memory, and mind as sharp as a tack, Mrs. Martin engaged the crowd, and reminisced about her past and her passion for doing good deeds for others. Organized by the Diaconate leadership, this was a very special gathering for a very special lady. In recounting her long association with Calvary, Sister Martin served energetically and faithfully over the years as an usher, as a member of the Missionary ministry, and as a member of the Garden Club.

Deacon Clyde Jones amused the crowd when he stated that Sister Martin had trained the current and past

generation of deacons in their in-home and hospital communion visitation. Quick to hand out a tongue lashing when due, Sister Martin spoke to Sister Dorothy Hollowell when she approached, "Now you are the person who sends out the cards every month, aren't you?" "Yes, ma'am," replied Sister Dorothy. Sister Martin's blunt retort was, "I really enjoy the cards, but it would be nice to see you once in a while."

All in all, the birthday

party was a joyful and glorious affair. Held at the Morris View Nursing Home where Sister Martin currently resides, the event was organized by Deacon Herbert, hosted by Deacon Ministry Chairperson, Monty Tatum, and attended by other members of the church who live at Morris View, and by Mrs. Naomi Still, a very close "adopted" relative and confidante. Rexx Hill, organist for Calvary, serenaded Sister Martin with a stirring rendition of her favorite gospel hymn, "I Come to the Garden Alone," and she sang every word along with him. God bless Sister Martin and may He bless her with many more fruitful and inspiring years. ■
