I. The Historical Theological Debate

Calvinism: double predestination; irresistible grace; sovereignty of God (John Calvin)

Arminianism: Christ died for all; human freedom; salvation is of grace. (James Arminius)

II. The Scriptural Perspective

A. The Paradoxes:

- a. "Special Elect" vs. Universal Opportunity (I Peter 1:2) (I Timothy 2:4)
- b. Divine Sovereignty vs. Human Freedom (John 6:44) (John 3:16)
- B. The Passage: Romans 8:28, 30
 - "Foreknow" Knowledge and choice (proginosko)
 - "Predestinate" had purpose in mind

- "Called" initiated the contact
- "Justified" to bring out righteousness or to make one righteous
- "Glorified" present glorification, future revelation. We are glorified in Christ, but the revelation awaits the coming of the Lord.
