II Corinthians Background

1. The Corinthian Context

Politically:

- 44 B.C. Refounded as a Roman Colony by Julius Caesar.
- Corinth is made capital of Achaia in 27 B.C. by Augustus
- Became the residence of the Governor

Economically:

- Wealthy city
- Maritime city with two harbors; one leading to Asia, the other to Italy
- Wealth came from trade, travel, bronze making, and Isthmian games.

Religiously:

- Pagan cults (Apollos, Aphrodite, etc.)
- Greek Philosophy
- Small Jewish Community
