A Portrait of Love I John 3:11-15

- **1.** The Three Tests: John implies that there are three tests that help to determine whether or not we know God:
 - The Moral test behavior (2:4)
 - The Social test brotherhood/sisterhood (2:9)
 - The Doctrinal test belief (2:22, 23)
- 2. The Social Test: "Agape" 3:11-15
 - A. <u>The Command of Love</u> (v.11)
 - the necessity of a command
 - an old command: John wishes to establish continuity with former teachings and commands as opposed to the "new" teachings of the heretics
 - Christ's commands to love:

"God" – Matthew 22:37

"Neighbor" – Matthew 22:39

"Enemy" – Matthew 5:43,44

"One Another" – John 13:34

- **B.** <u>The Contradiction of love</u> (vv. 12, 13)
 - The example of Cain *(see Genesis 4:1-8)* Cain's actions show the opposite of love:

Hatred cannot celebrate the success of another

Hatred resents the other (the brother)

Hatred destroys the other

- Cain represents the world which "hates" the children of God
- C. The Confirmation of love: Love or hatred of the brother/sister shows our true colors (vv. 14, 15)
 - Evidence of "passing from death to life" love is the test Love demonstrates the reality of the new life (see John 13:35)

Why is love the supreme test?

- Evidence of possessing eternal life - to affirm life demonstrates that I have "life"; to destroy it is evidence that I do not have it

"Hate and murder" – see Matthew 5:22
